<u>REGISTER</u>: Please register when you move into the parish. This is an opportunity to become acquainted with our faith community and to experience the joy of being part of the Church. Only registered parishioners, in good standing, can receive a Certificate of Eligibility to act as a Godparent or sponsor.



BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism is administered on the fourth Sunday of every month at 11:30 a.m. Parents are encouraged to invite family members to the 10:30 Mass as the Sacrament of Baptism takes place immediately following the Mass. Parents and Godparents meet for an enrichment class prior to the

Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. A Godparent must be a committed, practicing Catholic, and if from another parish, must have a certificate of eligibility from his/her pastor. This certificate should be brought to the enrichment class. A Christian of other denominations may serve as a Godparent along with a practicing Catholic.



MARRIAGE: Couples planning marriage are expected to attend Pre-Cana Conferences and to meet with the parish priest several times leading up to the marriage. The period of preparation time required is six months unless approved otherwise by our Pastor.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please call the rectory at any time for the Sacrament of the Sick. Also the Holy Eucharist will be brought to the sick and shut-ins upon request to the Parish Office. We celebrate a Communal Anointing of the Sick in June, near the *Feast of St. John the Baptist.*

Gospel Reflections

A Letter from Our Pastor, <u>F</u>ather Símí

Dear brothers and sisters,

"If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Today, our Lord teaches us to pray. This teaching of our Lord to pray is perhaps a practice that has become less and less common in our lives.

In our world where we are equipped with so much technological, economical and academic power, we tend to depend less on God's help sought through prayer and more on our own will and power to do something about issues and problems that increasingly overwhelm us in our time.

Today, we are inspired by God's word to have a profound confidence in God as our Father. Abraham in the first reading enjoys this confidence. He appeals for the whole of Sodom and Gomorrah to be spared for the sake of a few innocent residents.

Abraham who yearned to be a father for most of his own life was granted this infinite desire of his own heart to be a father when God gave him and Sarah their son Isaac. Abraham shows forth his fatherly love by appealing for a wayward and condemned people who were totally and utterly helpless against their own depravity and their impending doom.

Even though the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed, Abraham's fatherly prayer for them was not completely in vain. His persistent prayer to spare them on account of at least ten innocent people was answered on Good Friday.

It was on account of one innocent person, the only innocent person, the only just and sinless person, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, that Abraham's prayer was heard and answered.

Abraham's prayer persisted through centuries and found fulfillment in Jesus Christ, our Lord, the Son of the Father. Abraham's prayer was a very real and intimate share in the Father's prayer, the Father's desire for all of us his sinful and condemned children.

You and I are taught this day to pray, that is, to unite our restlessness for the Father with His fatherly desire for us His children. We pray because it is the movement of the heart in petition to the Father that opens us to receive the Spirit that the Father moves from the depth of His own Heart to us His children.

Our prayer, like Abraham's prayer, must persist because it is united to the eternal prayer of the Father for us His wayward children to be reconciled to Him. The less we unite our every desire for the Father and for each other with the prayer of the Son to His Father as he taught us in today's gospel, the less we become like them, the less we love like them, the less we will see peace.

In the depths of our feeling of helplessness in the face of all terror and sin and death that beset us, we cry to our Father in prayer. We join the Son as His brothers and sisters and pray with Him in the helplessness and terror of the cross, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do. Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

The Father whose love for us is infinite and unsurpassed answers the plea of His Son, and our plea. He gives us the Holy Spirit by whom we experience forgiveness and by whose power we experience the resurrection, the transformation of our sinful and fallen nature into His own and HIs Son's nature: their glorious nature of eternal love.

Let us pray. Fr. Simi
