**<u>Register</u>**: Please contact the parish office to register when you move into our parish.

Only registered parishioners, in good standing, can receive a Certificate of Eligibility to act as a Godparent or sponsor.

**BAPTISMS:** The Sacrament of Baptism is administered on the fourth Sunday of every month. Parents are encouraged



to invite family members to the 10:30 Mass as the Sacrament of Baptism takes place immediately following the Mass. Parents and Godparents must attend an enrichment class approx. 1 month prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. A Godparent must

be a committed, practicing Catholic, and if from another parish, must provide a certificate of eligibility from their pastor. A Christian of other denominations may serve as a Godparent along with a practicing Catholic.

MARRIAGE: A Saturday Mass for the Sacrament of



Matrimony may be celebrated no later than 1pm. Couples planning marriage are to contact the parish office & schedule a meeting with our wedding coordinator no later than 6 months in advance of the wedding. Shorter preparation

periods must be approved by our Pastor. Couples will meet several times with the Pastor throughout the preparation process. Couples are to attend a Pre-Cana program approved by our Pastor.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please call the rectory at any



time for the Sacrament of the Sick. Also the Holy Eucharist will be brought to the sick and shut-ins upon request to the Parish Office. We celebrate a Communal Anointing of the Sick in June, near the *Feast of St. John the Baptist.*

# The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

The fundamental dogma, on which everything in Christianity is based, is that of the Blessed Trinity in whose name all Christians are baptized.

The feast of the Blessed Trinity needs to be understood and celebrated as the mysteries of Christ and as the solemn expression of our faith in this triune life of the Divine Persons, to which we have been given access by Baptism and by the salvation won for us by Christ.

Only in heaven shall we properly understand what it means, to be in union with Christ, to share as sons and daughters in the very life of God.

There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, God!

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? You may say it is the finale to all the preceding feasts.

All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of our salvation by Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in



him might have

eternal life." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all

sacred functions. After Christ's ascension, he sent the Holy Spirit who became our Advocate, Teacher, our Consoler.

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity may well be regarded as the Church's *Te Deum* of gratitude over all the blessings of the Christmas and Easter seasons; for this mystery is a synthesis of Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost.

This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God. Sunday after Sunday we should recall in a spirit of gratitude the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us.

The Father created and predestined us; on the first day of the week He began the work of creation. The Son redeemed us; Sunday is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His resurrection. The Holy Spirit sanctified us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Sunday, therefore, is *the* day of the Most Holy Trinity.

May we ever be "on the alert" to the presence of the Trinity in our souls! At Baptism we became the adopted "children of the Father," "co-heirs with Christ," "temples of the Holy Spirit!"

In our offering of Holy Mass, "we will give glory to" the Trinity (Introit), and God will show "mercy to us" (Offertory, Communion).

On this Feast we should also renew our baptismal vows that this "profession of our faith. . .may be of profit to our health, in body and soul" (Postcommunion).

# OPEN THOSE DOORS
