

Gospel Reflections A Letter from Our Pastor, Father Simi



Dear brothers and sisters,

And when he had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

(John 20:22-23)

We celebrate today the end of the Easter Season with the great Solemnity of Pentecost. While it marks the end of our journey with our Lord through the very mystery of His own suffering, death, resurrection and ascension, it today begins our own life as disciples who must now be sent to the whole world.

Today, our lives are being renewed by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit that descended from the Father on our Lord on the day of His own baptism by John at the river Jordan today is felt anew in us who received the same Spirit from the Father and the Son on the day of our own baptism.

Today, we celebrate the abiding presence in us of the Holy Spirit that loved the world so much that He drove His Son into the barren desert, the lifeless desert, the loveless desert of human existence, of all of creation.

The Spirit which drove our Lord into Jerusalem, into the arms of persecutors, rebels, betrayers, haters, unfaithful and weak followers, and even executioners because He still wants to forgive them, convert them, and heal them, and save them, this same Spirit now becomes the love with which we breath.

Each time we gather with, around and in our Lord at Mass, He breathes His Holy Spirit into us. The Spirit He first breathed into us at our own baptism, He continues to breath into us each time at Mass and the Sacrament of our Reconciliation to God and each other.

The Spirit that our Lord breathes into us is as innocent and pure as a dove and powerfully purifying as fire. It is a fire that burns away our fear of Christ whom we have has failed to love faithfully. It is a fire that restores our relationship with Him and brings about peace.

The Spirit of peace that Christ breathes into us not only restores our relationship with Him but

now sends us with new courage and boldness to an unforgiving world, a loveless world, a dying world.

This world is not out there and apart from us. We are part of that world. It begins with us. We are in the world. Our spouse, our children, our parents are in the world. Our neighbors, our church, our parishioners and our priests and bishops are in the world.

The Risen Lord breathes the Holy Spirit first into the lives of His very own apostles, fear-filled apostles, weak apostles, guilty apostles. Forgiveness and reconciliation begins with them and today they are compelled by the Spirit of the Risen Lord to impart with Him and through Him this same Spirit of forgiveness and reconciliation to the whole world.

The Spirit is breathed on us by a body; the Risen Body of Christ who still has hands and feet, which still bears the wounds of His passionate love for us. The Risen Body of Christ in first appearing to His apostles now breathes the same Spirit and so now becomes the hands and feet of the wounded Body of Christ to all the world.

We too who are taught, governed and sanctified by the Risen Body of Christ in the Apostles and their successors are sent forth in the peace of being one body and one Spirit in Christ. Together with them, and never apart from them, we become ministers of forgiving love, of purifying love and reconciling love to the entire world.


TEACH THE CHILDREN

TO UNDERSTAND THE GOSPEL

During the Liturgy of the Word, it is not uncommon to see children reading from the hymnals trying their hardest to understand what they were hearing. But for the majority, these are just words on paper. Not surprising, as many adults struggle with interpreting the readings. Fortunately, we have Father's homily to help us along. I discovered that if I taught on the upcoming weeks' Gospel reading before the children heard it at Mass, they would recall our lesson, and understanding what they were hearing helped to engage them in the Mass. Each week I will briefly explain the following weeks' Gospel for you to use as a tool to prepare your child for Mass.

Next week we return to Ordinary Time and celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Gospel

reading is Matthew 28:16-20
This feast invites us to
consider what we believe
about God, who has
revealed himself to us in the
Trinity, one God in three
Persons.



This Gospel is sometimes referred to as "The Final

Commission." In today's Gospel, the eleven disciples go the mountaintop in Galilee, as Jesus had instructed them through Mary Magdalene and the other Mary. They see Jesus, and they worship and doubt at the same time. Jesus approaches them and commissions them to baptize and teach. It is a task for which Jesus had previously prepared his disciples; recall that Jesus had already sent the twelve apostles to preach the Kingdom of God and to heal. Yet earlier, the Twelve were sent only to the House of Israel; in this final commission, the eleven are told to go to all nations. The mission of Jesus is now to be taken to all people, and the task is to baptize and to teach. Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in the name of the Trinity. This continues to be the mission of the Church. Each of us who has been baptized shares in the life of the blessed Trinity and also shares in the Church's mission of inviting others to share in God's love.

One of the most striking films I remember is "Wings of Desire" (1987), "Wings" directed and cowritten by the German filmmaker Wim Much of Wenders' work is marked by a Christian-inspired spirituality; in past interviews he's noted that his life and work have been "profoundly formed by growing

up in a Catholic family." Wenders embarks on a documentary of Pope Francis' papal ministry and thought. The result - "A Man of His Word" - will be in theaters on May 18 from Focus Features. He focuses on the Pope's concern for the environment, the poor, and immigrants. He also captures the Pope's vigorous commitment to marriage, the family, and complementarity of men and women, a fact we witnessed firsthand here in Philadelphia during the World Meeting of Families 2015. The most absorbing moments in the film, not surprisingly, are spent with Francis himself visiting immigrants, the poor, the sick, the Shoah memorial Yad Vashem in Israel, and the Western Wall in Jerusalem. Wenders weaves an ongoing, intimate, one-on-one interview with the Pope throughout the film. It's a hugely effective technique; one has a sense that Francis is looking directly at, speaking directly to, the individual viewer. Wenders and Focus Features (and the Holy Father himself) deserve our gratitude for offering the world such an exceptional encounter with the Successor of Peter. May it touch thousands of hearts.
