



From your Pastor

From the beginning to the end, the Scripture has given a litany of God's countless and undeserved acts of mercy for sinners. This same merciful love of God is seen as the main theme in today's readings.

In the first reading Isaiah was a comforter of his people and was their companion during their years of Babylonian exile. He promised that God would repeat the wonders of their exodus from Egypt and lead them home. When the circumstances threatened their hope, it seemed that all were lost then God with great mercy encouraged the people not to dwell on the sins of their past. God was doing something new for them. This newness meant forgiveness and reconciliation for all who would welcome God into their lives and respond to God's love and mercy.

In the second reading Paul experienced the merciful love of God that made him see everything as rubbish in front of knowing Christ. In the Gospel, we see the mercy of God incarnated in the words and actions of Jesus. The people were willing and ready to stone the woman for adultery. Jesus asked them to look within themselves.

When we pray "Our Father" and say that we belong to Christ, then there can be no other way for us than the way of mercy. Pope Francis wrote that the mercy of God is the beating heart of the Gospel, which in its own way must penetrate the heart and mind of every person. It is essential for the Church and for the credibility of her message that she live and testify to mercy.


