





From your Pastor

Throughout the history of the world, woman/man conquered the other man/woman. Rulers conquered cities, emperors conquered the Kingdom, but there remains one territory that is unconquered: "the heart of human". Jesus Christ conquers it. He is a person who has love and mercy for his people. Therefore, he humbles himself to serve and becomes one with us.

Today we celebrate the feast of Palm Sunday. We commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem to accomplish the paschal mystery. It is not the city of Jerusalem, but it is human hearts. He enters our personal life with great joy and celebration. For us the day becomes light before the darkness, sunshine before storms.

As we celebrate the kingship of Christ let us look at our life, what is happening here and now? Christ as our king who enters our hearts, our personal Jerusalem. Is Christ able to enter? Come let us make our hearts to be opened through our daily prayers, reading the Word of God and understanding it, and finding time to go to the church so that He may enter our hearts.




