program approved by our Diocese.

be brought to the sick and homebound by our Pastor or one of our Communion Ministers upon request.

Today's readings paint a vivid picture of a banquet, a feast for the soul. In Proverbs, the Wisdom herself prepares a table, calling out to the simple and the foolish: "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed!" (Proverbs 9:5). This feast is not one of earthly delights, but of knowledge, understanding, and the very bread of life.

In the Gospel, Jesus makes this metaphor even more explicit. He declares, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." (John 6:51). This is a radical statement that challenges our very understanding of nourishment.

We crave meaning and purpose yet feel lost in a sea of distractions. This is where the feast of Wisdom comes in.

May this Sunday be a day of spiritual renewal, with hearts overflowing with the joy and wisdom of the divine banquet. Let our lives, after the spiritual banquet, be broken and shared for the betterment of humanity. Amen.


