**Certificates of Eligibility:** May be issued only to registered parishioners who currently reside within our parish boundaries, who have been registered parishioners at least six months, are 16 yrs. and older, who have received all their Sacraments of Initiation, and are actively practicing their faith in our parish.

**BAPTISMS:** The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a Sunday

following at 11:45am. Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another parish, must provide a

Certificate of Eligibility from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

**MARRIAGE**: The Sacrament of Matrimony Mass may be celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays.

Couples planning marriage are to contact the Parish Office & schedule a meeting with our Pastor no later than 6 months in advance of the planned wedding date. Couples are to attend a Pre-Cana

program approved by our Diocese.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Please call the Parish Office at

any time to request a visit from our Pastor for Anointing of the Sick. Communion will

be brought to the sick and homebound by our Pastor or one of our Communion Ministers upon request.

We celebrate a Communal Anointing of the Sick in June, near the Feast of St. John the Baptist.

## FROM YOUR PASTOR

The Mother Church today celebrates Gaudete Sunday, namely Rejoice Sunday. The Church eagerly awaits Jesus' coming with immense joy which is now the midway mark of Advent. This marks the commencement of the O Antiphons, which are the seven gemstones of our liturgy. These O antiphons which trace back to the 4th century are specifically reserved for each day until Christmas Eve -Christ which addresses with seven magnificent Messianic titles, based on the Old Testament prophecies and attributes of Christ.

The theme of the readings today focuses on joy. This joy is closely connected with salvation. The responsorial psalm of the day is from the gospel of Luke. It is the Magnificat, Mary's song of praise for the wonders God has worked through all ages. Here, too, joy is that of God's salvation unfolding in history. Paul in the second reading highlights the theme of joy, where one has to live in joy and the peace of God which will not only surpass all understanding but will guard one's hearts and minds in Jesus Christ, keeping in mind that the Lord may come anytime and that the Lord is near. Therefore, Paul invites us to rejoice in the Lord, be gentle to all and not to worry about anything.

Joy is not self-centered; rather, it finds fulfillment in serving others. The alphabets of the word J-O-Y seemingly refer, first, to Jesus, then, to others, finally, to you. Hence let us rejoice in Christ who is with us and therefore he is 'near'!

# OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE FEAST DAY - DECEMBER 12<sup>™</sup>

Our Lady of Guadalupe, in Roman Catholicism, the Virgin Mary in her appearance before St. Juan Diego in four visions in 1531. The name also refers to the Marian apparition itself. Our Lady of Guadalupe holds a special place in the religious life of Mexico and is one of the most popular religious devotions. Her image, of a woman of mixed Indigenous and European features (mestiza) wearing a turquoise-colored mantle surrounded by a sunburst, has played an important role as a national symbol of Mexico.

In 1737 Our Lady of Guadalupe was proclaimed patroness of Mexico City, and in 1746 her patronage was accepted by all the territories of New Spain, which included part of present-day California as well as Mexico and regions as far south as Guatemala and El Salvador. In 1754 Pope Benedict XIV approved her patronage and granted proper feast and mass for December 12. Pope Pius X proclaimed her patroness of Latin America in 1910 and in 1935 Pius XI approved her patronage over the Philippines. Veneration of Our Lady of Guadalupe has been particularly strong among women, especially in Mexico, and since at least the early 18th century the devotion was spread throughout the world by the Jesuits and other religious
