



FROM YOUR PASTOR

The readings speak about the greater revelation of God which ends up with the greater response from Isaiah, St. Paul and Simon Peter. The first part of the readings vividly speaks about the Holiness and greatness of God. God's Holiness stands unique, apart, unapproachable, incomprehensible and unattainable. It is ineffable. The three personalities Isaiah, St. Paul and Simon Peter in the readings recognize the magnanimity of the Holy God who takes initiative to call them and acknowledge their unworthiness humbly.

When we see God, we see ourselves in the true light. No one has ever encountered God and remained the same in history. Chan says, 'A greater revelation of God demands a greater response towards him'. God doesn't call the qualified, rather He qualifies the called. God touches the unclean tongue of Isaiah and makes him clean to do His Mission.

Jesus calls poor fisherman Simon Peter and promises to make him a humble servant to preach good news to the poor and to lay his life down for God's mission. God is more concerned about what He is doing in us than through us. When we truly understand God as He is, our immediate response is that of Isaiah's response, "Here am I, send me".




