




Certificate of Eligibility from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

FROM YOUR PASTOR

We might think God's call is only for particular people, like priests and nuns, but it's an invitation for all to 'come and see'. Everyone who believes and is united in Christ through baptism is called to be a disciple of Christ.

In the first reading, God called Samuel, who was asleep in the temple of the Lord. God personally calls Samuel for his mission. Samuel listens to God saying, "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening." The reading calls us to be open and stay alert to the promptings of the Spirit in our hearts and respond to God with humility.

In the second reading, Saint Paul reminds us that we belong to God and our body is the temple of God. So, God resides in us and we are called to offer ourselves completely to the Holy Spirit which we have received from God. God has saved us through the blood of Jesus Christ and we are called to respond to His love and glorify Him through our life.

In today's Gospel, we can understand the right response to God as we encounter Jesus in our lives. The encounter inspires us to grow in an intimate relationship with Christ, be transformed by his life and imitate him in our everyday lives as true disciples of him.






