

<u>Certificates of Eligibility</u>: May be issued only to registered parishioners who currently reside within our parish boundaries, who have been registered parishioners at least six months, are 16 yrs. and older, who have received all of their Sacraments of Initiation, and are actively practicing their faith in our parish.

BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a Sunday

following at 11:45am. Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another parish, must provide a

Certificate of Eligibility from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Matrimony Mass may be celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays.

program approved by our Diocese.

FROM YOUR PASTOR

Today, the Church celebrates the feast of 'Epiphany of the Lord'. 'Epiphany' means manifestation. However, it doesn't mean that the manifestation of Jesus was only for the three wise men, but also for the whole world symbolically.

In today's Gospel, we find two different types of people: King Herod and the three wise men. Herod wanted to kill Jesus by all means, because he felt that Jesus would be a threat to him as he wanted to hold on to his power and throne. He was unable to see Jesus as the Messiah or a King who was born to redeem His people who were living in the clutches of sin and death; whereas, the wise men followed the star and left for an unknown destination to worship the child Jesus. Not only that, their with Lord encounter Jesus was empowering and enlightening, that they even defied the orders of King Herod and went home through some other way.

Like the wise men from the East, we too need to recognize the signs of the time and try to find our Savior in our hearts and in our daily lives. We should not close our eyes to the truth though it may not be pleasant; or otherwise, we too, like Herod, may fall into selfishness and sin and thereby fail to find goodness outside of ourselves.


