

<u>Register in the Parish</u> Please contact the Parish Office to register when you move into our parish.

Certificates of Eligibility to act as Godparent or Sponsor may be issued only to registered parishioners who have been registered here at St. John the Baptist Parish at least six months, are 16 yrs. and older, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation, and are actively practicing their faith in our parish. If married, your marriage must have been witnessed and blessed by a Catholic Priest or have special permission approved by the Archbishop. A person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason is not eligible to be a sponsor and, therefore, we cannot issue a Certificate of Eligibility.

BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a Sunday at



11:45am (immediately following the 10:30am Mass). Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another

parish, must provide a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Matrimony Mass may be celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays.



celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays. Couples planning marriage are to contact the Parish Office & schedule a meeting with our Pastor no later than 6 months in advance of the planned wedding date. Couples are to attend a Pre-Cana program approved by our Diocese.

From Your Pastor

Who is my neighbor? Responding to this, Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. This parable has often been interpreted as one in which Jesus is telling us that those in need are our neighbors, or that it has an anticlerical edge, in which Jesus is showing up the priestly class by mentioning the priest and Levite as not reaching out to the one in need.

If these were the meanings, then there would be no need to make the third person that passed by that way, a Samaritan. The reason why Samaritan is introduced is because Jesus wanted the lawyer who was a Jew, to go beyond the narrow definition of neighbor, to go beyond his prejudice.

Therefore, today's parable invites us to look at our relationships with other people. It invites us to ask ourselves a simple question: How do we respond to people in need? Do we turn around, or fall in step with them, and offer help? Or do we walk on by pretending they don't even exist? It's a sad fact of life that sometimes we treat needy strangers better than we do our own needy spouses, parents, or children. Today's parable does not invite us to go out, risk our lives, and become heroes. It invites us to reach out, risk our pride, and become humans. It invites us to ask, "Can I help?"

Lord, give us eyes to see the pain of others, ears to hear the cry of other people. Lord, give us compassion to become involved in other people's needs. Lord, give us humbly never to pass by for fear of rejection, rather, give us courage to reach out to all.


