

<u>Register in the Parish</u> Please contact the Parish Office to register when you move into our parish.

Certificates of Eligibility to act as Godparent or Sponsor may be issued only to registered parishioners who have been registered here at St. John the Baptist Parish at least six months, are 16 yrs. and older, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation, and are actively practicing their faith in our parish. If married, your marriage must have been witnessed and blessed by a Catholic Priest or have special permission approved by the Archbishop. A person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason is not eligible to be a sponsor and, therefore, we cannot issue a Certificate of Eligibility.

BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a Sunday at



11:45am (immediately following the 10:30am Mass). Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another

parish, must provide a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Matrimony Mass may be



celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays. Couples planning marriage are to contact the Parish Office & schedule a meeting with our Pastor no later than 6 months in advance of the planned wedding date. Couples are to attend a Pre-Cana program approved by our Diocese.

Please call the Parish Office at any time to request a visit from our Pastor for Anointing of the Sick. Communion will be brought to the sick and homebound by our Pastor or one of our Communion

Ministers upon request.

From Your Pastor

Today's Gospel gives us a powerful moment in the life of Jesus - His visit to the home of Martha and Mary in Bethany. It's a scene filled with love, hospitality, and deep spiritual insight. But it also reveals a tension that many of us can relate to - the tension between doing and being, between serving others and sitting at the feet of Jesus.

Martha is busy. She's working hard, trying to make everything just right for her guest and not just any guest, but the Lord Himself! Her work is good, generous, and deeply rooted in love. But in the process, she becomes anxious, distracted, and resentful. She even complains to Jesus, asking Him to tell Mary to help her.

Mary, on the other hand, simply sits at the feet of Jesus, listening to His words. And Jesus tells Martha, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need for only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her."

This is not a criticism of Martha's service - it's a gentle correction of her anxiety and distraction. Jesus reminds her, and us, that our work must flow from our relationship with Him. We must never get so caught up in doing things for Jesus that we forget to spend time with Jesus.

We live in a culture that glorifies productivity, busyness, and achievement. We are always "on the go," multitasking, checking emails, running errands, working late. Even in our parishes and ministries, we can become like Martha - always busy but often spiritually drained.

Jesus is gently reminding us today that if we don't first sit at His feet - in prayer, silence, Scripture, and Sacrament – our service can become just another source of stress.

This Gospel is not about choosing between Martha or Mary. The Church needs both. We need the action of Martha and the contemplation of Mary. What Jesus is teaching us is about balance - letting prayer guide our work and allowing silence to renew our souls.

SAINTS JOACHIM AND ANNE

There will be a blessing of Grandparents during the Masses on July 26th & 27th.



On July 26 the Roman Catholic Church commemorates the parents of the Virgin Mary, Saints Joachim and Anne. The couple's faith and perseverance brought them through the

sorrow of childlessness, to the joy of conceiving and raising the immaculate and sinless woman who would give birth to Christ.

The New Testament contains no specific information about the lives of the Virgin Mary's parents, but other documents outside of the Biblical canon do provide some details. Although these writings are not considered authoritative in the same manner as the Bible, they outline some of the Church's traditional beliefs about Joachim, Anne and their daughter.

The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves to rigorous prayer and fasting, in isolation from one another and from society. They regarded their inability to conceive a child as a surpassing misfortune, and a sign of shame among the tribes of Israel.

As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah. An angel revealed this to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honor their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth; and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

After Mary's birth, according to the Protoevangelium of James, Anne "made a sanctuary" in the infant girl's room, and "allowed nothing common or unclean" on account of the special holiness of the child. The same writing records that when she was one year old, her father "made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel."

"And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations' ... And he brought her to the chief priests; and they blessed her, saying: 'O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be forever.'"

The protoevangelium goes on to describe how Mary's parents, along with the temple priests, subsequently decided that she would be offered to God as a consecrated Virgin for the rest of her life, and enter a chaste marriage with the carpenter Joseph.


