
BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a

From your Pastor

Today's Gospel speaks of seeds, weeds, sowing and growing. In the parable, a man sowed good seeds in his field. But his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, while everyone was asleep. The wheat that sown is the goodness in our hearts and the weeds are evil thoughts in our hearts. We are wide-awake yet we are not aware of what is going on. We are "spiritually asleep", we are so focused on ourselves and unmindful of others. We are passive and lazy. This is the devil's best chance to sow his weeds.

The servants asked the master, "Do you want us to go and pull up the weeds?" Master did not want to do so. He allowed the weeds to grow with the wheat. It teaches us that we are not in a position to judge the spiritual state of others. The one we judge as "bad" may be better than us. Their intentions might be much better than we understand or even worse.

Let us stop judging others because we are imperfect. Even Jesus was judged wrongly. He had all the good intentions for mankind but men of His time condemned Him and had Him nailed to the cross. Brothers and sisters, here is a point of reflection, - in some instance we might have been weeds among the wheat; if God had not been lovingly patient with us, where would we be today?




