



FROM YOUR PASTOR

In today's second reading, writing to the Christians of Corinth, St. Paul explains that Jesus' death was a stumbling block to the Jews. They couldn't accept that the Messiah, their Savior and King, would die, that power and domination and influence were what counted in their world.

That common criminal should be worshiped as Lord was nonsense, crucifixion was something to be ignored and laughed at and rubbished as it still is by many in our own society today. It is the very heart of our faith. Everyone is called to answer the call. It is the power and wisdom of God. It is with the eyes of faith one can see the power of love in the death of Christ.

In the Gospel reading, we find a dramatic scene where Jesus shows himself as Lord of the Temple. He drove out all the traders of cattle, sheep and pigeons and the animals that were used in sacrifices, and the money changers. Such business practices should have been carried out just outside of the temple. The Jews were trying to question him —what sign can you show us to justify doing this?

Then Jesus replied: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it." Indeed, Jesus spoke about another temple where God lived – his own body. Through this event we are reminded during Lent of what we are preparing to remember and celebrate - the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.




