





From your Pastor

In the first reading we see that the Yahweh reveals himself to Abram and blesses him with offspring. Further, He makes a covenant with him saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river. In the Gospel Jesus, as he was praying, is filled with the power of God. His clothes become "dazzling white," which says that he is the very source of divine glory.

Most of the time we are like those disciples not knowing what happens among us but planning to settle down if anything seems comfortable. The transfiguration of Jesus was clearly seen by the disciples to whom the glory was revealed. But still they were terrified by seeing the cloud. They had also seen him talking to Moses and Elijah but did not realize His glory. When Abram was worried about his heir, the Lord gave him hope and a new future and so Abram believed in the Lord. Whereas the Lord in a special way given his own Son but they did not know Him fully. Therefore, the Lord directs them to Jesus because He is the Way, Light and Life for us.

We are called to listen to Him and follow Him, in a special way die with Him and resurrect with Him. That is what St. Paul says in the second reading that "the Lord Jesus Christ will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body".


