



From your Pastor

The readings of today are so important for a clearer appreciation of the Easter liturgies. We feel inspired and renewed in the first reading by hearing how Peter and his companions stood up to the authorities who had forbidden them to speak in the name of Jesus. Peter was nothing before he was called by Jesus. Once again after the death of Jesus he feels a sense of hopelessness. But after Jesus' coming again to his life, he feels confident that his Lord is with him. That is why we see in the first reading a refined and renewed Peter with the love of risen Lord. In John Gospel 15:5 - we see "you can do nothing without me." If Jesus is in our lives everything is possible through him, and we also will be confident like Peter who encountered and welcomed the risen Jesus to his life once again.

In the Gospel, we see that Peter decides to go back to fishing - his former life. We are always struck by how quickly, after a religious celebration, even a religious experience like Easter, that we so quickly return to our former life and its patterns. The Risen Lord recalls Peter by repeating the way he called him the first time. It reminds us that we often need to be renewed in our call, and our ability to recognize the Lord right before us, by remembering how we were first called. We need to be renewed and reanimated by the memory that Jesus has much more power than we do.

Let us realize that our nets are pretty empty and we need to jump into the water of transformation and swim to the shore to get closer to the one who can fill any empty nets the Lord who can fill any emptiness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen
