e on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a Sunday following at 11:45am. Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another parish, must provide a


Certificate of Eligibility from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.

celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays. Couples planning marriage are to contact the Parish Office & schedule a meeting with our Pastor no later than 6 months in advance of the planned wedding date. Couples are to attend a Pre-Cana

program approved by our Diocese.





FROM YOUR PASTOR

Risen Lord Jesus' exaltation is celebrated as the feast of the Ascension. During the forty days after His resurrection, many people experienced Him in a glorified body. Through the readings of the day, Jesus lets all the believers know that to be a Christian is to be a proclaimer and an evangelizer.

The Ascension of the Lord speaks about Jesus' move into Heavenly Glory. Jesus promises the Holy Spirit as the source of Heavenly power for the Apostles. He commands them to be His witnesses, throughout the whole world, by bringing the Good News to all and living out His teachings in their lives. In the second reading, St. Paul says that we are united with each other through our faith in Christ. There is one Body and one Spirit.

Paul also teaches us that God revealed His might in the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ and His exaltation over all angelic forces. It is in the Ascension that we see Jesus entering fully into the Life and Glory of God. This feast is the celebration of Jesus' Glory after going through suffering and cruel death, the Glory in which we, too, hope to take part in one day. This feast tells us that the Church must be a Community in mission, guided by the Holy Spirit and confident of God's protection even in the midst of suffering and death. Jesus is in each one of us and with us through the power of the Holy Spirit.
