



### A Prayer for the People of the Ukraine

### From your Pastor

The season of Easter is nearly at an end. The central theme of today's readings is a challenge to us to rejoice in our suffering for the Faith because the more we suffer; the more we are identified with Jesus who has liberated us from the bondage of sin by his suffering and death. The first reading tells us how the apostles waited in prayer for the promised coming of the Holy Spirit, who would enable them to preach and bear witness to Christ in spite of persecutions. In the second reading, Peter challenges his early Christian audience and us to view and accept sufferings as an opportunity to be more fully one with Jesus.

Today's gospel reading tells us that we need to glorify Christ by the lives we live: When we love, even when it costs who will stand with the poor and oppressed, who will use their money as a gift from God to bless other lives, who will use their money to guarantee that the Gospel is preached all over the world, we glorify God.

We also glorify God by our prayer life and our faithful observance of the Lord's Day. We glorify Jesus by offering Him humble and selfless service in our brothers and sisters – distributing lunches to the homeless begging on the street-corner, volunteering at homeless shelters, teaching children, helping with after-school care. Finally, we glorify God by speaking kind, merciful, loving and encouraging words to everyone we encounter, and praying for them and their needs.

### MOTHER MARY - HELP US TO IMITATE YOU

"Devotion to Mother Mary is not spiritual etiquette; it is a requirement of the Christian life," says Pope Francis. Pope Pious XII promoted the pious practice of honoring Mother Mary in the Catholic Church. Mother Mary, Mother of Jesus and of the Church, plays an important role because she gave new life to the world when she gave birth to our savor Jesus Christ. She set a great example of committed "Yes" to the will of God and showed us the way to the Father through her son Jesus. 


