O most glorious ever-Virgin Mary, the Mother of Christ our God, accept our prayers and present them to Your Son and our God, that for the sake of you, He enlighten and save our souls.

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

This Sunday, September 17th, throughout the United States, Catholic Parishes celebrate CATECHETICAL SUNDAY, a day to recognize, bless, and commission all those in the Church who formally Share the Good News and teach the Message of Jesus. At St. John the Baptist, at the 10:30 A.M. Mass, Father Lucas will recognize, bless, and commission the catechists of our Parish Religious Education Program as well as other parishioners who impart the Gospel Message of Jesus in other teaching ministries of the parish community.

Please pray for our volunteer catechists and our Catholic school teachers, that they grow in love of Christ themselves and that they are strengthened to teach the Message of Truth of Jesus with love, authority, and clarity.

FROM YOUR PASTOR

The readings for this Twenty-Fourth Sunday concern forgiving those who wound us and being reconciled with them. All three readings today remind us of the path to forgiveness, mercy, and reconciliation and challenge us to walk this, the only Way to Life.

Sirach, in the first reading, reminds his listeners that if they don't heal and forgive and show mercy, they can't expect to receive mercy from God in return. It is unwise to nurse grudges and wise to forgive because our life span is very short and our eternal destiny is decided by how we forgive, how we work for reconciliation with those who wound us, and how we render humble and loving service to them.

In today's Psalm, (Ps 103), the Psalmist sings, "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness." In the second reading, Paul reminds us that we have to forgive others because we belong to Christ who, by his own example in forgiving those who killed Him, taught us how we must forgive in our turn. Since we humans are related to each other as brothers and sisters of Jesus, we are in the family of God, so hatred and bitterness toward anyone should have no place in our hearts.

In today's Gospel, through the parable of the two debtors, Jesus teaches us that there should be no limit to our forgiveness and no conditions attached to our reconciliation. We represent the greater debtor in the parable because we commit sins every day and, so, we need God's forgiveness every day. But we must forgive in order to be forgiven. Jesus explains, after teaching us the prayer Our Father, "For if you forgive men their trespasses, your Heavenly Father also will forgive you."




