FROM YOUR PASTOR

In the first reading from the Book of Numbers, we see Eldad and Medad prophesying in the camp and Joshua requesting Moses to stop them. But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all Lord's people were prophets, that the Lord would put his Spirit on them!" Similarly, in the Gospel we find John telling Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him because he was not following us."

Often, we don't see the bigger picture in life and judge by our likes and dislikes. We fail to appreciate the good works of others because we make selfish interests and self-glory our concern, instead of God's glory. A person who sees God's glory in all the good works, would not feel jealousy but real joy, because all good works bring glory to God.

Jesus taught his disciples that the one, who wants to be the first must be the servant of all. "If they embrace this attitude, then they can hardly have feelings of jealousy and rivalry for someone else through whom God is at work."

Today Jesus also reminds us that if any good work is being done, we should be tolerant and appreciative of those works. The Gospel reading also puts a warning for us to live our faith responsibly. Our life example affects the faith of the little ones, namely the children and people of simple faith.
