

<u>Register in the Parish</u>: Please contact the Parish Office to register when you move into our parish.

<u>Certificates of Eligibility</u>: May be issued only to registered parishioners who currently reside within our parish boundaries, who have been registered parishioners at least six months, are 16 yrs. and older, who have received all of their Sacraments of Initiation, and are actively practicing their faith in our parish.

BAPTISMS: The Sacrament of Baptism may be scheduled to take place on a Saturday at 10am or 11am; or on a



Sunday following at 11:45am. Parents and at least one Godparent are to attend our Enrichment class prior to the Baptism. You will need to call the Parish Office to register for this class. Godparents must be committed, practicing Catholics, over the age of 16, and if from another parish, must

provide a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their pastor. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian Witness alongside a Catholic Godparent.


MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Matrimony Mass may be celebrated no later than 1pm on Saturdays.

FROM YOUR PASTOR

Today's readings speak about God's plan to bring peace, unity and love. In the first reading, we find prophet Jeremiah's heart burning with fire regarding the violence and destruction. St. Paul in the second reading invites Romans to prepare their mind and body to work for God's plan. Jesus explains it clearly to his disciples by asking them to take up cross and follow him in the gospel reading. In other words, the cross is to stand for truth and justice.

Today the world is grappling with injustice, corruption, suppression, exploitation, human trafficking, poverty etc. We see all these in our society. We are responsible for our suffering brothers and sisters because we have chosen the path of indifference or silence. Adding to this, Jesus says whoever is not with me is against me (Mt: 30:12). We expect others to stand against those inequities as Peter expects Jesus to do in the Gospel reading. He understands Jesus in human perspectives. He fails to realize that he has to carry the cross. We in our daily life forget that we are created to bring faith, hope, peace, harmony, unity, forgiveness and love among the people.


